

Uniform Crime Part I & Part II Reporting

The Livermore Police Department reports crime occurring in the city based on the FBI's Uniform Crime Report (UCR) standard. UCR is a statewide program designed to provide a nationwide view of crime based on the submission of statistics by law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The UCR program classifies crime into two groups: Part I and Part II offenses.

Crimes

Each participating agency is required to report Part I crime on a monthly basis. Monthly crime statistics are reported to the California Department of Justice, which will in turn forward the data to the FBL UCR data is used in law enforcement administration, operation and management, as well as to track the fluctuations in the level of crime throughout America and the City of Livermore.



Part I offenses are selected for submission to the DOJ because they are considered to be the crimes most likely reported and considered as crimes that occur at a sufficient frequency for comparative purposes. These offenses are broken down further into two classifications: violent crimes and property crimes. Violent crimes are defined in the UCR program as those offenses which involve force or threat of force.

Transparency

The Livermore Police Department is committed to fostering a culture of transparency and accountability throughout the Department and with the community it serves.

This information is made available to members of the public, the media, law enforcement partners and other stakeholders which allows for honest analysis related to the quality work of our employees.

Transparency with the public enhances the trust of community members in the personnel & operations of the Livermore Police Department.

Although every reasonable effort is made to verify data, accuracy is subject to the constraints of the report generation process as well as the manner, format, point in time of any query and the policy in force at the time. Additionally, follow-up investigations frequently change crime classifications.

Crime Definitions

HOMICIDE: Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter. The complete definition can be found <u>here</u>.

RAPE: Rape including attempts (not including statutory offenses). In 2013, the FBI revised the definition of rape, which now includes sexual assaults of males and other forms of sexual penetration. The complete definition can be found here.

ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury.

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. To classify an offense as a burglary, the use of force to gain entry need not have occurred.

COMMERCIAL BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. To classify an offense as a burglary, the use of force to gain entry need not have occurred.


NON-VEHICLE LARCENY: The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

VEHICLE LARCENY: The theft of articles from a motor vehicle, whether locked or unlocked. This type of larceny includes thefts from automobiles, trucks, truck trailers, buses, motorcycles, motor homes, or other recreational vehicles.


VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is self-propelled and runs on land surface and not on rails. Motorboats, construction equipment, airplanes, and farming equipment are specifically excluded from this category.

ARSON: Any willful or malicious burning or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc...

2022 Crime PART 1 CRIME Statistics BREAKDOWN


