HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN YOUR PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING - You can participate in the meeting in a number of ways:

Speaker Cards - If you wish to address the Planning Commission, you must complete a speaker card for each item about which you want to speak. The speaker card box is located in the Council Chambers lobby. Place your speaker card in this box behind the tab that corresponds to the agenda item number. Staff will collect the cards for each item immediately before the item is to be considered and gives the speaker cards to the Chair. The Chair will call speakers to the public lectern. No cards will be accepted once the presentation on that item has commenced.

Citizens Forum is an opportunity for the public to speak regarding items not listed on the agenda. Speakers are limited to a maximum of three minutes per person. The Chair may reduce the amount of time based on the number of persons wishing to speak. You should be aware that the Planning Commission is prohibited by State law from taking action on any items that are not listed on the agenda. However, if your item requires action, the Planning Commission may place it on a future agenda or direct staff to work with you and/or report to the Planning Commission on the issue.

Public Hearings - The topic of the hearing is typically summarized by staff, followed by questions from the Planning Commission and a presentation by the applicant. The Chair will then open the hearing to the public and offer an opportunity for public comments. You may take a maximum of three minutes to make your comments. The Chair may reduce the amount of time based on the number of people wishing to speak.

Other Agenda Items are also open for public input including *Consent Calendar or Matters for Consideration* items. These comments are also subject to the three minute limit.

Written Materials may be submitted by the public. If you wish your materials to be sent to the Planning Commission prior to the Planning Commission meeting, they must be submitted to the Planning Division no later than noon on the Thursday five days prior to the Tuesday meeting. Those items will be copied and sent to the Planning Commission with the agenda packet. Materials submitted after noon on Thursday five days prior to the Planning Commission the night of the meeting, provided the materials are received in the Planning Division office by 12:00 p.m. on the day of the meeting; however, it is unlikely the Planning Commission will be able to read the materials before the start of the meeting. Therefore, it is suggested you give a verbal summary of your materials at the meeting.

The **Planning Commission Agenda and Staff Reports** are prepared by City staff and are available for public review on the Friday evening prior to the Planning Commission meeting in the Civic Center Library, 1188 South Livermore Avenue, Livermore and on the City's website <u>http://www.cityoflivermore.net</u>. The Agenda and staff reports are available for review at the Council Chambers lobby prior to the meeting.

Under Government Code §54957.5, any **supplemental material** distributed to the members of the Planning Commission after the posting of this agenda will be available for public review in the City of Livermore Planning Division, 1052 South Livermore Avenue, Livermore, and on the City's website http://www.cityoflivermore.net. If supplemental materials are made available to the members of the Planning Commission at the meeting, a copy will be available for public review at the Council Chambers, 3575 Pacific Avenue, Livermore.

4. **PROJECT REVIEW**

4.01 Consideration of 1) Downtown Concept Plan Landscape Design Guidelines Report for streetscapes, pedestrian connections, parks, plazas and other public spaces identified within the approximately 8.2 acres Downtown Concept Plan area; and 2) Park design elements for an approximately 1.5-acre public park located on the west side of South Livermore Avenue between First Street and Railroad Avenue. The project includes landscaping, hardscape, pedestrian walkways, interactive art and play structures, seating, and other furnishings.

- Location: 1) Design Guidelines Area generally bounded by North L Street, First Street, the Bankhead Theater Plaza, and Railroad Avenue
 2) Park Site – West side of South Livermore Avenue, between First Street to the south and Railroad Avenue to the north
- Site Area: 1) Design Guidelines 8.2± acres
 2) Park Site 1.5 ± acres
- Applicant: City of Livermore
- Application Numbers: 1) Policy Proposal Implementation (POLI) 18-002; and 2) Downtown Design Review (DDR) 18-005
- Public improvements: The entire project as described above is a public improvement.
- Zoning: Downtown Specific Plan (DSP) Downtown Core
- General Plan: Downtown Area (DA)
- Historic Status: None
- CEQA: Recommend finding the environmental impacts of the project were analyzed by, and the project is consistent with, the 2018 Addendum to the Downtown Specific Plan 2009 Supplemental Environmental Impact Report.

Recommendation: Staff recommends the Planning Commission adopt resolutions recommending the City Council certify the environmental document, adopt the Downtown Concept Plan Landscape Design Guidelines, and approve Stockmen's Park design.

- 4.02 Consideration of a request to develop a five-level, approximately 180,000 Report square-foot parking garage on the east side of South L Street between First Street and Railroad Avenue, with approximately 475 to 505 parking stalls. The project also includes a surface parking lot to the east of the proposed parking garage with approximately 48 parking stalls, a trash compactor enclosure, a service road between the parking structure and the existing buildings on First Street, landscaping, and pedestrian walkways, including a paseo connecting the proposed parking garage to First Street.
 - Location: 50, 62, 74, and 90 South L Street and 2044-2048 First Street
 - Site Area: 4.12± acres
 - Applicant: City of Livermore
 - Application Number: Downtown Design Review (DDR) 18-006
 - Public improvements: The entire project as described above is a public improvement.
 - Zoning: Downtown Specific Plan (DSP) Downtown Core
 - General Plan: Downtown Area (DA)

- Historic Status: A Certificate of Appropriateness (COA18-022) has been approved for the demolition of a building on the project site that is over 50 years old.
- CEQA: Recommend finding the environmental impacts of the project were analyzed by, and the project is consistent with, the 2018 Addendum to the Downtown Specific Plan 2009 Supplemental Environmental Impact Report.
