The visual schedule should be presented/reviewed with families before starting the activity, and referred back to as needed to guide the student through the activity. Items can be checked off/crossed out as they are completed.

If needed/wanted the bottom two squares can be used when reflecting on which airplane flew further students can circle or touch the square to tell what they think. If VODs are available, students can also activate one of the buttons to indicate their response.

Although the source materials suggest not showing students possible ways to create their bridge, having visuals helps some students understand the task and gives them options and an ability to particiate even if they are having trouble coming up with ideas. This board can be presented to students/families as needed. Students can make a choice by touching or saying the name of the fold they would like to use. If VODs are available, students can also activate one of the buttons to indicate their choice.
